


World TB Day Events

The Basic and Translational Science Core is pleased to host their first Visiting Speaker for the Emory/Georgia TRAC, Dr. Chetan Seshadri of the University of Washington. Dr. Seshadri is a PI of the Seattle TRAC (SeaTRAC) and will be presenting on Monday May 15, 2023. This will be the Emory/Georgia TRAC's second collaboration with SeaTRAC following a successful joint session on World TB Day.

NOA: The first TRAC Opportunity Award goes to Dr. Ankita Garg of UGA



The first ever Emory/Georgia TRAC Opportunity award was given to Dr. Garg of UGA to complete a project studying the regulation of primary macrophage metabolic pathways in response to M. tuberculosis infection. The goal of the Accelerator Awards is to efficiently provide small amounts of funding to fill key funding gaps for targeted specific needs, and overcome barriers for critical research.
